
CVA Plan B Overview

Children's Village Academy (CVA) will open officially for the 2020-21 school year for students on August 17, 2020. CVA will begin the school year in the **Plan B-Option A (Moderate Social Distancing)** model with 100% of students in grades K-8 in attendance for a full school day, utilizing virtual learning settings that comply with social distancing practices. The school will implement the plan in phases (Phase I-IV) in an effort to gradually return to normal, pre-COVID-19 operation. ***Parents who prefer for their child(ren) to stay home, have the option to participate in remote learning (Plan C). The school will ensure that the parent has a device and instructional materials to continue learning virtually from home. Our *highest priority* is student safety while providing quality instruction!!

Essential Components of CVA's Plan B:

Social Distancing and Cleaning/Disinfecting

Cleaning, Disinfecting, & Sanitizing	 Inventory will be assessed weekly to ensure necessary supplies are stocked and made available to all staff and students to support healthy hygiene behaviors. 	
	 Hand sanitizer stations (filled with hand sanitizer with at least 60% alcohol) have been installed at every building entry and exit door, as well as, each classroom and/or virtual learning setting to reinforce 	

consistent handwashing and healthy hygiene. Each classroom will be equipped with dehumidifiers to purify the air throughout the school day. An increase in the frequency for routine cleaning and disinfecting has been established within the school's master schedules. Restroom & Hallway Supervision Restroom breaks will be staggered by class during established times of the day (after breakfast, lunch, and at the end of the school day). Hall monitors and designated school staff will assist teachers in monitoring no more than 5-7 students at a time during scheduled, grade-level restroom/break times. Recess and Outdoor Activities Recess times will be staggered to allow for only one class group to participate in recess or outdoor activities at a time. NOTE: No students will be allowed on playground equipment during

Phase I.
School Assemblies There will be no school assemblies or major school events occurring
and Events during Phase I. All events, including special recognition
ceremonies/activities such as Tiger Walks and Awards programs will be
modified to adhere to regulations/guidelines provided by the Center of
Disease Control (CDC) and state/local health agencies.
Safety Drills CVA will continue quarterly safety drills (Lockdown, Evacuation, etc.) and monthly fire drills as outlined in the CVA School Emergency/Evacuation
policy, with modifications to adhere to the social distancing to mitigate the spread of COVID 19.

School Nutrition

Meal Service

- Staff and students <u>will not</u> be allowed to congregate in the cafeteria for breakfast and lunch as normal. The SN staff will deliver meals to classrooms at scheduled breakfast and lunch times.
- All SN staff are required to wear face masks and/or face shields (or both) at all times. SN staff will gradually transition to traditional cafeteria style service as directed by local and state health guidance.

Transportation



Social Distancing	• Students should be seated with <u>1 student per seat</u> and must sit as close to the window as possible (no students should be sitting at the edge of the seat or near the walking aisle.
	• Siblings (from the same home) will be allowed to share a seat.
	• <u>Students</u> must also wear a face mask, which will be available on each school bus if the student does not have his/her own mask. Bus drivers must wear a face mask or face shield (or both) at all times.
	• Students <u>will not be allowed</u> to alter bus assignments temporarily (ex. riding home with a friend).
	 Bus drivers will assign seats, clearly mark spacing on buses (seats, aisle, etc.), and practice effective loading and unloading practices to promote social distancing.
Cleaning, Disinfecting, & Sanitizing	• Transportation staff will receive training on the safe, appropriate use and storage of cleaning/disinfecting supplies. Drivers must disinfect highly touched surfaces and seats <u>between daily transport and</u> at the <u>end of each work day</u> .
	 Students <u>must not</u> be on the vehicle while it is being cleaned/disinfected.

Staff, Student, and Visitor Health Screenings

Staff and School VisitorsArrival and Screening

All staff and visitors will be required to complete the "Temperature & Symptom Screening Checklist" before entering the building.

Student Arrival and Screening

Students will complete the "Temperature & Symptom Screening Checklist" as they board the school buses. Bus



drivers, along with selected bus monitors, will be equipped with touchless thermometers and will be responsible for conducting the health screenings as students board the buses daily.

- An <u>employee</u> with a temperature of 100.4 or higher and/or whose screening checklist indicates that he/she exhibits symptoms of or has had exposure to COVID-19, will be asked to return to his/her home and contact the school principal and/or the designee immediately for further guidance on the COVID-19 "Return to School" policy.
- A <u>student</u> with a temperature of 100.4 or higher and/or whose screening checklist indicates that the child exhibits symptoms of or exposure to COVID-19, will be asked to return to his/her home. The bus driver and/or monitor shall observe the child as they return to their home and notify the parent immediately. Parents/guardians must contact the school for further guidance on the COVID-19 "Return to School" policy.

Visiting the School

- Visitors <u>will not be allowed to enter the ACADEMIC buildings</u> (buildings that house the classrooms) on either campus, unless deemed absolutely necessary by the Principal or a designee. If a parent is present to sign their child out of school, the child will be escorted to the office by designated hall monitors.
- Parents/visitors requesting to speak with an employee will be asked to schedule an appointment to meet with the employee at another time.

Suspected, Presumptive, or Positive Cases of COVID-19 (What if someone becomes ill?)



Parents/guardians of students who become ill or symptomatic while at school will be contacted immediately and the student will be isolated and monitored in a designated area until the parent/guardian arrives. If the parent/guardian does not have transportation to pick up their child, then an on-site bus driver will transport the individual home via the *transit* school bus. An employee who does not have transportation or is too ill to transport themselves will be offered the option of being transported home by an on-site driver as well.

An employee/student who is suspected or presumed symptomatic will be informed that returning to school is permitted only if the following conditions have been met:

- If the symptoms subside within 24 hours, there is no fever without the use of fever-reducing medicines, and the individual feels well for 24 hours
- If symptoms have not subsided in the 24 hour time period, the employee/student must report to a medical professional for COVID-19 testing.
 - o If a person is diagnosed with COVID-19 by a medical professional based on a test or their symptoms <u>or</u> does not get a COVID-19 test but has had symptoms, they will be instructed to stay home until they (or a family member if younger child) can answer YES to the following three questions:
 - 1. Has it been at least 10 days since the person first had symptoms?
 - 2. Has it been at least 3 days since the person had a fever (without using fever reducing medicine)?
 - 3. Has it been at least 3 days since the person's symptoms have improved, including cough and shortness of breath?

Confirmed Cases of COVID 19:

In accordance with child care guidance, the local health department will be notified of confirmed COVID-19 cases among children and staff (as required by NCGS § 130A-136.) and seek guidance in notifying staff and families immediately and maintain confidentiality in accordance with FERPA, NCGS 130A-143, and all other state and federal laws.
